The site of America's first scheduled airmail pickup in 1939 is a modern facility that is one of the busiest corporate and commuter airports in the state with scheduled service throughout the day, including charter service to destinations such as Atlantic City. This is also the location of periodic air shows that have featured the Air Force Thunderbirds and the Canadian Snowbirds.

The first Benedictine institution in the United States, founded in 1846, has grown into one of America's top-ranked liberal arts and sciences colleges. Campus visitors are welcome anytime for self-guided walking tours, concerts, lectures, theatre, sports, art gallery exhibits, and other special events. Tours of the historic Archabbey Basilica are also offered. You may want to stop by the College Bookstore in Carey Center, the Basilica Gift Shop or the monastery's Gristmill General Store to sample a variety of food baked with grain from the 150-year-old mill.

Located just off Route 30, this family destination provides fun for all ages. Activities include a Go-Kart track that is 1,528 feet long with a double over and under bridge. Single, double and pro karts are available. Paintball games are played on four wooded fields, with a group rate for 10 or more and Sunday afternoon walk-ons. Slow down with a delightful game of miniature golf or visit the driving range. An air-conditioned arcade and snack shop offer a chance to cool down and grab a bite to eat. Statler's is open Monday through Friday noon-10 pm, Saturday 10 am-11 pm, and Sunday 12:30-10 pm.

This museum is a must-see for art lovers and those interested in regional history. Located in downtown Greensburg, it features works by great American artists such as Mary Cassatt, John Singer Sargent and Louis Comfort Tiffany, plus artwork concentrating on the beauty and history of southwestern Pennsylvania. Along with a gift shop carrying gifts inspired by its collection and coffee bar, the museum provides a "KidSpace" where children can make their own works of art. A small donation is suggested and children under 12 are free. Museum hours are Wednesday through Sunday 11-5 pm and Thursday 11-9 pm.
